## ***Equine Herpes Virus (EHV) Seminar***

Equine herpes virus (EHV) is a common virus that occurs in equine populations around the world – including right here at home.

In the past few weeks, veterinarians have diagnosed the neurologic form of equine herpes virus type 1 (EHV-1) in more than a dozen horses living in the Saskatoon area.

What can you do to protect your horses? Come to this evening session and learn more about equine herpes virus from Dr. Hugh Townsend, an infectious disease specialist at the Western College of Veterinary Medicine (WCVM). Find out about the types of equine herpes virus, clinical signs of disease, treatment options, and key management and hygiene practices that will help to reduce the spread of EHV infection.
